About the Role

We are seeking an experienced and professional Pillar Lead – MEAL Pillar to join its team for a full-time position. Samuel Hall's <u>MEAL</u> Pillar empowers civil society, inter-governmental organisations, governments, small businesses and other stakeholders with rigorous research, insightful evaluations and comprehensive solutions, driving positive change in contexts of migration and displacement, international development and social equity.

The Pillar Lead holds leadership responsibilities over the thematic research pillar and within Samuel Hall at large. This includes defining the strategic direction of the pillar with the Director of Programmes, leading personnel management, ensuring oversight and final approval on all projects under the pillar and contributing to business development and representation of Samuel Hall.

About You

The Pillar Lead is responsible for research projects from both management and content perspectives. He/she will oversee the Research Managers who are responsible for producing high-quality field research plans, methodologies and tools, as well as being able to draft, with minimal supervision, all required outputs for a given project. The Research Managers are also in charge of conducting post-project debriefs, lessons learned and evaluations, to ensure their institutional contribution. Their role is essential to maintaining Samuel Hall research standards - from conceptualisation to delivery - on key themes of priority for the organisation. The Pillar Lead will lead projects as the Research Manager on a routine basis.

Tasks and Responsibilities

Objective 1 - Pillar Strategic Direction and Implementation

- Set research vision for the pillar and coordinate with broader research goals at Samuel Hall in collaboration with the Director of Programmes.
- Participate in the OKR process and any internal strategic discussions.
- Update the Strategic Workforce Plan (SWP) and any pillar strategy documents.
- Hold regular coordination meetings with other pillar leads.
- Lead on the conceptual strengthening of and inputs on pillar projects.
- Focus on specific thematic areas of research and develop said in-house expertise.
- Guide project teams to understand and implement the vision for the research.

Objective 2 - Pillar Management and Coordination

- Manage and coach pillar and project team members.
- Make recruitment decisions for each project high-level project staffing.
- Hold coordination and staffing meetings with pillar staff and other RMs.
- Liaise with Human Resources on contract discussions/recruitment, aligned with the pillar SWP or on a project basis; flag any team or HR concerns in real-time.
- Monitor the implementation of the project A to Z cycle for pillar projects.
- Review Research Planning Team (RPT) content ahead of time and participation in RPT meetings.
- Review and approve project budgets and all deliverables to be submitted to the client.

Objective 3 - Business Development, Representation and Communications

• Represent Samuel Hall at meetings, presentations, conferences, workshops on the key pillar themes.

- Lead business development for the pillar including proposal development and guidance.
- Contribute to dissemination of strategies and activities as agreed with the Director of the Programmes/Partnerships Unit.

Job Requirements

- A Masters degree in International Relations, International Development, Political Science, or a related field.
- A minimum of 8 years of relevant experience in research.
- Proven experience in project management, monitoring and evaluation and leading teams.
- Proven experience in writing research papers, consultancy reports, evaluation assignments, and policy briefs.
- Proven expertise in quantitative and qualitative data analysis and tools (for example, R, SPSS, NVIVO).
- Knowledge of key institutional frameworks and stakeholders.
- Strong presentation skills and ability to build professional relationships.
- Excellent verbal and written skills in English.
- Keen attention to detail.
- Ability to be patient and to work well within a global team.
- Ability to cope well under pressure, occasionally work irregular hours and meet tight deadlines.
